

Daisy Dollar Program

What is a Daisy Dollar Program?

The “Daisy Dollar” program is designed to help service units improve attendance at Leader Meetings and recognize volunteers who are most active by rewarding them for participation. As activities are completed, volunteers receive “Dollars” and save them to “buy” prizes.

What Activities Earn “Dollars”?

Each service unit determines how volunteers can earn “Dollars”. There can be established categories as well as extra options. Here are some ideas (some are worth more than one!):

- Register your troop or add new girls
- Be on time to Leader Meetings
- Participate in service unit events
- Turn in your Financial Report on time
- Share a troop activity idea
- Coordinate a service unit event
- Wear your Girl Scout uniform
- Attend a council event
- Service Projects
- Serve as delegate
- Complete required or enrichment training
- Bring an item to the auction
- Be a member of the service team
- Hold a recruiting event
- Bring snacks to Leader Meetings
- Be a “Leader Buddy”
- Perform a flag ceremony outside Girl Scouts
- Turn in product sales manager’s name
- Bridge up with your troop

How do You Spend the “Dollars”?

Volunteers typically use the “Dollars” to purchase items at an annual silent auction – often at year-end. Some service units hold special auctions throughout the year, too. Depending on the service unit, these prizes can be donated to the service unit or purchased by the service team. Some ideas:

- Coupons for services or meals
- Gift certificates
- Snack or gift baskets
- Books to use in planning troop activities
- Troop supplies
- Camping gear
