2023 Camp Tallchief Resident Camp Descriptions



MINI CAMP (2 NIGHTS)

Not ready to spend five nights at camp? Try our mini sessions to explore all that camp has to offer during your two night stay.

Tallchief Trails: Mini Camp

Try Tallchief Trails Mini Camp and explore all that camp has to offer during your two night experience. Take a dip in the pool and experience other traditional camp activities. Entering grades 1-4 Fall 2023.

Choose Your Own Adventure: Mini Camp

Try Choose Your Own Adventure Mini Camp and spend two nights planning and experiencing your idea of the perfect camp stay with your cabin mates. Entering grades 1-4 Fall 2023.

Giddy Up: Mini Camp

Giddy up and go! It's a wonderful world learning about ponies and horses! Learn about horseback safety and the parts of a western saddle. Learn how to brush and groom your horse and then take a ride in the arena. This includes two arena lessons. Long pants & boots/shoes with ½ inch heels are required. Entering grades 2-4 Fall 2023.



TRADITIONAL RESIDENT CAMP (5 NIGHTS)

Tallchief Trails

This is your chance to try a bit of everything camp has to offer! Try activities like swimming, nature programs, arts and crafts, swimming, canoeing, and hiking. On top of all your activities, your group will also tie-dye and spend time by the campfire. Work towards earning your Camper badge. Campers will be grouped into cabins by age and buddy preference. Entering grades 2-12 Fall 2023.

Choose Your Own Adventure

Ever wanted to plan your own adventure? This is your chance! Work with your cabin to plan a week unlike any other. Pick from traditional camp activities like archery, boating, arts and crafts, nature activities and more! Don't forget to take a trip down the slide at the pool! Earn your Tallchief patch. Campers will be grouped into cabins by age and buddy preference. Entering grades 2-12 Fall 2023.

HORSEBACK SPECIALTY SESSIONS (5 NIGHTS)

Level 1: Spurs & Bits

Learn to groom and saddle your horse for at least four arena lessons. The week is sure to rustle up a lot of fun! Explore skills of cowgirl life and enjoy the other camp activities too. For the beginner or intermediate rider. Long pants and boots/ shoes with ½ inch heels are required. Juniors will earn the Horseback Riding badge. Entering grades 3-5 Fall 2023



Level 2: Saddle Up

Now that you know how to groom and saddle your horse, it's time to hit the trails. You will have at least one arena lesson, and then it's off you go! Learn about equine health, mending fences, and maintaining trails. When you're not riding the range, you'll enjoy the other camp activities, too. For the intermediate rider. Long pants and boots/shoes with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch heels are required. Juniors will earn the Horseback Riding badge. Entering grades 5-7 Fall 2023.

Level 3: With a Bit of Tack

Learn about horses, riding styles, and equestrian grooming and care. Trotting with balance and control while successfully steering in an arena will be the focus of this session. A trail ride, washing and watering the horses, and cooling off at the pool could be just a few of the activities you'll engage in. More experienced riders will get to try faster gaits and more advanced challenges. You will love horsing around in this program. Long pants and boots/shoes with $\frac{1}{2}$ inch

heels are required. This is a prerequisite for Don't Rein Me In. Entering grades 7-10 Fall 2023.

Level 4: Don't Rein Me In

Ride into the sunset after improving your equine skills by riding in the arena or out on the trails. Riders will be evaluated and challenged to improve their horsemanship. Don't forget about the sleepover you'll have with your horse on the trail. Long pants and boots/shoes with ½ inch heels are required. Campers must have attended With a Bit of Tack. Entering grades 7-10 Fall 2023.

WATER SPORTS SPECIALTY SESSIONS (5 NIGHTS)

Bubble Up

Create your own tropical paradise at camp. Make a volcano. Hang out in a hammock. Eat your breakfast in the pool or have lunch on the lake. Build a raft and race your friends across the cove. You will also have time for other camp activities, too. Comfort in water and basic swimming skills required. Entering grades 4-6 Fall 2023.

Aquatic Adventures

Splash into summer! Girls will spend their week trying out paddleboards, building new skills in canoes and going stomping through the water, all while performing different experiments to become Citizen Scientists. When not exploring all the water sources camp has to offer, girls will experience art, archery, and so much more! Entering grades 6-9 Fall 2023.



Deck Hands

Get an introduction to the wide world of sailing during this session. Learn how to sail a Sunfish on your own. Haul in the sheet and you are off on an exciting adventure. Skills include knot tying, boating terminology, and rigging procedures. Come build your sailing skills, participate in a camp regatta, and enjoy other camp activities as well. Comfort in water and strong swimming skills required. Entering grades 6-9 Fall 2023.

Wet & Wild

Slip and slide into the camp's pool, go tubing and kayaking, play water games, and try out camp's paddle boards. Take polar bear swims, moonlight dips, have a floating meal, and do lots of splishing and splashing. From rowing races to flipping a canoe, this is sure to be a boatload of fun. Spend a day at Safari Joe's H2O in Tulsa. Comfort in water and strong swimming skills required. Entering grades 6-9 Fall 2023

Water Bugs

Do you love being at the lake? During this session, campers will have the opportunity to learn and improve their water-skiing, wakeboarding, and kneeboarding skills with individual instruction. Must be a strong swimmer and previously attended a five night session at Camp Tallchief. Entering grades 6-9 Fall 2023.



TARGET SPORTS SPECIALTY SESSIONS (5 NIGHTS)

Arrow Up

Practice archery every full day during your camp stay. Try different types of bows, learn how to care for equipment and become a skilled archer. Juniors will work toward the Practice with Purpose badge. Cadettes will earn the Archery badge. Entering grades 4-6 Fall Ž023.

Right on Target

Do you want to hit that bull'seye? Pull back the string and let those arrows fly! Experience using a compound bow! This specialty program will not only teach you the basics of archery, but also allow you to compete for nationally recognized skill level awards. Whether you're a beginner or a master archer, your skills will benefit from this exciting program. Hopefully, it's right on target! Entering grades 7-10 Fall 2023.

LEADERSHIP SESSIONS

Counselor-in-Training (CIT) Program

(3 weeks with weekends at home) So, you want to be a camp counselor? Find out what counselor life is really like! The CIT Program enables campers to better understand the Girl Scout practices and principles related to camping and outdoor education. The CIT Leadership Project was developed to afford Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors the opportunity to experience the challenges and rewards of working with younger campers in an outdoor setting. Becoming a CIT enables campers to gain insights into the responsibilities of program delivery and camp operations, offers experience in staff responsibilities, program

goals, leadership styles, child development, group dynamics, outdoor skills, and conflict resolution. Campers will build a resource notebook with games, songs, and recipes to aid in their training.

The CIT program is designed to take place over the course of two summers. CIT 1 & 2 are each three-week programs designed to give Girl Scout Seniors and Ambassadors a chance to hone their leadership skills. The experience gained in CIT 1 is expanded upon during the second summer through skill specialization, safety practices, and leading activities. Along the way there will be lots of camp memories, laughs, beautiful campfires, and building of life-long friendships.

A completed application is required to be completed after registering for CIT 1.

Must attend CIT 1 to attend CIT 2.

The CIT program is a total of six weeks of training (3 weeks per summer) with the intent of working at least one full summer at camp after completion, if eligible.

CIT 1

At least 14 by June 1.

CIT 2

At least 15 by June 1.

RESIDENT CAMP

CANCELLATION, REFUND, AND TRANSFER POLICY

All activities require advance registration and payment by the registration deadline.

- All deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- There are no refunds after the registration deadline.
- Cancellations must be received before the registration deadline.

The individual making the registration will be responsible for any balance due for:

- Cancellations received after the registration deadline
- Any balance due for girls who are "no shows"

In the event that GSEOK has to cancel a program, a full refund including the deposit will be provided. This policy includes all methods of payment including those made with Cookie Program Credit.

No refund will be given for campers:

- Arriving with active bed bugs, lice, eggs, or nits
- Arriving late or leaving early
- Who are sent home for communicable diseases
- Who are sent home for exhibiting improper behavior

TRANSFER REQUEST

Requests to transfer sessions must be made before the registration deadline and require a \$25 session transfer fee.

2023 CANCELLATIONS **DUE TO ILLNESS**

While we are unable to provide a no-risk cancellation refund policy, we assure you that if your camper is ill we will first try to reschedule. As a nonprofit that relies on income from program payments, it is important to understand that the financial implications of cancelling from a camp session are serious. Prior to camp, many preparations are made that incur expenses for the council.

► Gold Award Process

The Girl Scout Gold Award requires council approval before beginning work on the project. Use Go Gold Online to apply for the Gold Award (**gogold.girlscouts.org**).

Girls who complete their project and submit their final report by December 31 may be eligible to receive their award at a celebration in early April of the following year.

Bronze & Silver Award Process

Visit **gseok.org/bronze** or **gseok.org/silver**, complete the form online, and submit the Intent to Earn, and after completion, the Final Report.

Go Gold Workshop

Are you ready to Go Gold? Learn about the prerequisites you need to complete before beginning the Gold Award process. Attend this informal meeting and let's talk about it! This course is required for girls prior to working on their Gold Award. Workshops will be held in January, February, April and May.

Ambassador Journey Weekend:

Your Voice, Your World

Have you just bridged to the Ambassador level? Do you need to complete a journey before you can start your Gold Award? If so, this is your chance to get a jump-start on the Your Voice, Your World journey!

Your Voice, Your World: The Power of Advocacy. How often have you seen something that really needed to be changed and wondered, "Why isn't someone doing something about that?" This journey, for eleventh- and twelfth-graders gives Girl Scout Ambassadors a way to be that someone – an advocate with the power to start the first flutter of real and lasting change. While creating their own "butterfly effect," they'll learn skills - such as networking, planning, and speaking up for what they believe - that will prepare them for life beyond high school. This event will cover every step but the Take Action project. This is an individual event. If multiple girls from a troop are attending they will be placed in the same cabin for sleeping, but will be split up into different groups during activities. Please make sure girls are aware of this before signing up for this April weekend.



LEADERSHIP OPPORTUNITY

Girl Advisory Committee

The Girl Advisory Committee serves as the girl voice for our council. You will help Program Managers in advising them on programs to offer to girls of all ages, as well as be the first in line of helping shape what Girl Scouts will look like here in Eastern Oklahoma.

Meeting dates are given well in advance once trip selections are made. Travelers are expected to not miss more than two meetings per Girl Scout year (Oct – Sept). There will be specifically required meetings that you must attend.

Girl Scouts must be 15 years old by June 1, 2025 to attend this travel opportunity.

Girls wishing to be considered forthis trip must attend an interest/info meeting before applying. Interest meeting dates are as follows:

After attending an interest meeting, the traveler must complete an online application. This application takes about 30 minutes to complete and must be completed in one setting. Application consists of demographic information, five short answer questions, skills ranking, an essay, and request to provide the name and email addresses for two non-relative references. **Application deadline is May 15**, **2023.** Applicants will be informed of trip selections by June 15, 2023. Cost of the trip is \$3,800 with a \$200 non-refundable deposit. All girls selected for the trip must adhere to the following payment schedule/cancellation policy:

• Program Fee for the trip includes a non-refundable deposit due at the time of trip selection.

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Be Prepared for Troop Camping!

Camping is great way for girls to explore leadership, build skills, and develop their appreciation of nature. Volunteers can get prepared by taking Camper Training.

Reservations can be scheduled for Camps Swannie, Tallchief, and Wah-Shah-She, as well as the Troop House in Tulsa (one-night only), Eaton Lodge in Cushing, the Ponca City Program Center, and the Girl Scout Service Centers in Bartlesville and McAlester.

All adults spending the night with a Girl Scout troop or group must be registered members with current background checks.

SCHEDULING

How to schedule a council camp or facility for a one- or two-night stay: The council uses a lottery system four times a year to schedule troop camping. Complete Form #576F (Request for Reservation of Council Campsite) and submit by the following deadlines:

- March 1 (for May-July)
- September 1 (for Nov-Jan)
- June 1 (for Aug-Oct)
- December 1 (for Feb-Apr)

Once you receive notice of placement, Form #585F (Request for Approval of Activity or Overnight) and payment will be due four (4) weeks in advance. If you miss the lottery, you can still submit a request 6-8 weeks in advance of your requested date. Placement will be first come first serve for those requests.

Submit all forms and questions to camps@gseok.org.

BUDDY CAMPING

If your troop wants to buddy camp with another troop staying in the same cabin, unit, etc., you can share trained/certified people (troop camper, first aider, etc.). No more than two troops can share the same troop camper or first aider. Both troops must submit required paperwork and both troops will pay the usage fee.

REQUIRED TRAINING

The troop must have a person with the following training before you may use any council facility:

• Site Orientation, First Aid/CPR, and Beyond the **Meeting** training are required for the Troop House (usage with NO outdoor cooking or outdoor skills), Eaton Lodge (Cushing), Ponca City Program Center, and the Girl Scout Service Centers in Bartlesville and McAlester.

• Site Orientation, First Aid/CPR, Beyond the Meeting, and Troop Camper training are required for the Troop House (with usage of outdoor cooking or other outdoor skills).

• Site Orientation, First Aid/CPR, Beyond the Meeting, and Troop Camper training are required for Camps Swannie, Tallchief, and Wah-Shah-She.

CANCELLATION

Refunds can only be issued when a cancellation is received at least four (4) weeks before the activity date. Please read all the information sent to you in the scheduled and approval notices, and the DoubleKnot receipt confirmation. There are two from DoubleKnot. One is a placement confirmation with an invoice. Another with the actual payment receipt confirmation.



SERVICE UNITS:

Service Unit Camp Outs are scheduled with the eligible units on a rotating basis. Once scheduled, the coordinator should submit Form #586F (Service Unit Activity Information) eight (8) weeks in advance.
