TROOP HOUSE

- Who built the Troop House? What year was it dedicated?
- Find the names on the bricks at the memorial.
- Identify four different kinds of trees on the property.
- Follow the trails and see where they lead.
- Build a fire in the fire ring. Make S'mores and sing "Linger".
- Count the Trefoil-shaped wall sconces.
- Walk the maze from two different entrances.
- Find the bell and identify the animal on it.

CAMP SWANNIE

- Go fishing in the pond.
- Play volleyball and/or basketball.
- Build sand castles in the volleyball court.
- Hike to McQuiddy Point.
- Find the names of at least ten different people or companies who contributed to the building of Camp Swannie
- Visit the Wishing Well. Why are the troops on the bricks around the base special?
- Hike Talannie Trail to Tallchief and back. Take a break at the Gazebo.
- Each yurt is named for a flower. Find out those names.



CAMP TALLCHIEF

- Read the story of Kihekah Steh (Tallchief).
- Find the "Gone with the wind" picture. Do you see Tallchief's statue?
- Name all eleven sleeping areas.
- There are two bells at Tallchief. One is on the east side of the Lodge. Find the other one.
- Hike Talannie Trail.
- Catch a fish – or at least try to catch one!
- Count the number of fish on the west wall of the pool house.
- Walk through Linda's Web.

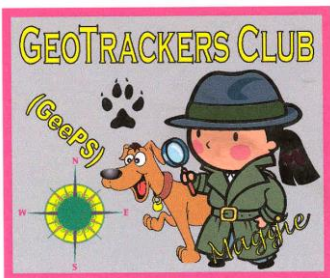


CAMP WAH-SHAH-SHE

- Learn the legend of Camp Wah-Shah-She.
- Take a hike and find each of the following: the Arts & Crafts Pavilion, Ta, Wapiti, Wasabe, Tho-xe, A-Ki-Ki-Pa.
- Visit Lake Higo.
- Draw a map of camp. Include all of the places you have visited.
- Hike to Niawaski (Littleman Falls) for lunch.
- Explore the Conestoga Wagons.
- Find C-Otazah, the Lodge and Conference Center.
- Find out what plants, animals and birds live at camp. Illustrate three of each by casting, printing, drawing, photographing or writing about them.

CAMP S'MORE

After visiting all the council campsites, adventure out! Go camping in a state park or wilderness area. You might even try camping at a facility operated by another Girl Scout council.



While exploring your camping options, you might like to use a compass or GPS unit to find your way or locate a geocache. Doing so will qualify you for the **GeoTrackers Club**. Geocache capsules have been placed at all council campsites and are waiting to be discovered!
