## Job Summary

The Seasonal Lead Counselor will directly supervise and effectively lead the unit staff and campers assigned to that unit (~3 counselors and 10-12 campers). The Lead Counselor will provide a safe and nurturing environment for campers and staff. The Lead Counselor will be actively involved and have a positive attitude about all camp activities and will ensure a fun and educational camping experience for all campers. Resident camp employment is seasonal, with dates of employment approximately May – August.

## **Essential Duties and Responsibilities**

- 1. Follow established procedures for supervising camper health and enforcing all safety regulations.
- 2. Assume responsibility for health and safety of campers and staff.
- 3. Maintain positive relations with families, visitors, and the public at all times.
- 4. Follow all camp rules and regulations and enforce them among peers.
- 5. Actively participate in staff training and meetings.
- 6. Work cooperatively with unit, program, and administrative staff to provide an enjoyable environment for all campers.
- 7. Provide opportunities so that each camper will have a positive camping experience.
- 8. Participate and instruct campers in emergency procedures.
- 9. Assist each camper and staff member in meeting personal goals and those established by the camp for camper and staff development.
- 10. Respond to and provide opportunities for discussion of individual or group problems or concerns.
- 11. Guide activities and experiences through use of girl planning and Girl Scout Program.
- 12. Supervise all aspects of the camper's day including wake-up, cabin/unit kapers, meals, rest periods, evening activities, bedtime, cookouts, and after-hours duties as assigned.
- 13. Take responsibility for the welfare of each person in the unit and aid in solving all problems.
- 14. Initiate the planning of unit activities, evening programs, overnights, and other events with campers and staff, as appropriate.
- 15. Be an integral part of the unit activities and get to know campers and staff on an individual basis.
- 16. Be knowledgeable about the eating habits, diets, and general health of campers and staff.
- 17. Ensure unit staff are enforcing and following all rules and are fulfilling all of their assigned duties.
- 18. Correct and document, as necessary, situations that endanger the emotional or physical safety of any person.
- 19. Inform the Resident Camp Director of any camper or staff problems, issues, or concerns.
- 20. Ensure unit, cabins, dining hall, and kaper areas are kept clean.
- 21. Submit all required paperwork on time.
- 22. Other duties as assigned or required.

## **Minimum Qualifications**

- 1. Must have current GSUSA membership and be at least 21 years old.
- 2. Current First Aid and CPR certifications or the willingness and ability to obtain.
- 3. Ability to plan and schedule programs, activities, and staff members.
- 4. Ability and/or experience in supervising staff and campers.

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- 5. Ability to model behavior consistent with the Girl Scout Mission, Promise, and Law.
- 6. Sound judgment and problem-solving skills for dealing with daily issues in a variety of situations.
- 7. Ability to work effectively with people from diverse backgrounds.
- 8. Patience to deal with 5 or more people at the same time.
- 9. Ability to lift and move equipment weighing approximately 25 pounds.
- 10. Ability to endure occasional exposure to sun, heat, and animals such as bugs, snakes, bats, etc.
- 11. Physically able to move about the camp property in various environmental conditions.
- 12. Ability to speak distinctly to communicate with members and staff on the phone or in person.
- 13. Desire and ability to work with and relate to children and one's peers.
- 14. Willingness to accept supervision and guidance.
- 15. Ability to teach and/or assist in teaching skills and activities.
- 16. Act as a team player with the desire to do whatever is necessary to make the total camp program successful.
- 17. Ability to live in an assigned area with a group of campers and staff for the duration of the camp season.
- 18. This position is a Safety Sensitive position.
