Booth sales will begin Feb. 11 at Walmart, Bass Pro, Lowe's, Mother Road Market, Woodland Hills Mall (by the carousel) and drive-thru booths at select Arvest Bank branches during the weekend. Customer pickup also will be an option at these locations.
