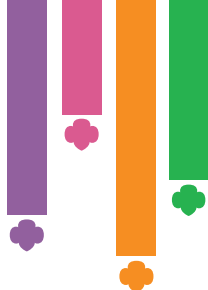

### Cat Beds for Shelters

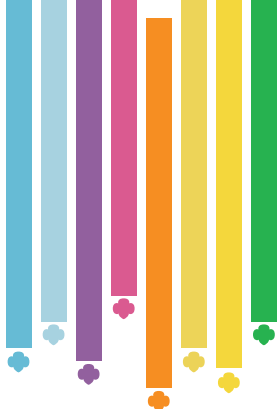

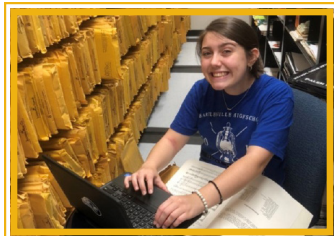
## ABIGAIL (ABBIE) CLAUSSEN

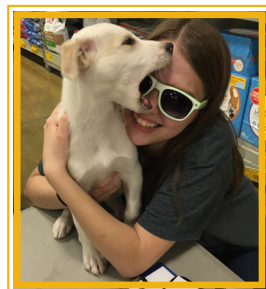
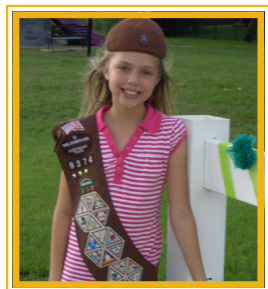
### Fostering for the Future

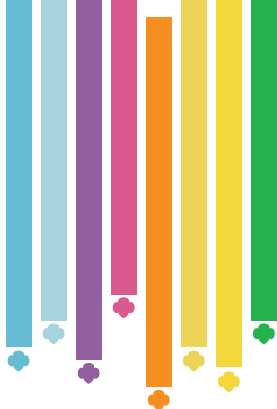

## ANNA JONES

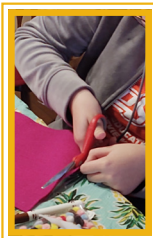
### Join the Pack: Self Advocacy Day

### Focus on Reading

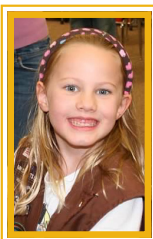

## CARYS STRINGER

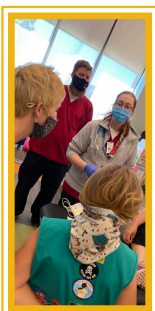
### Give Blood, Get Cookies! Program

## **TRINITY WILSON**

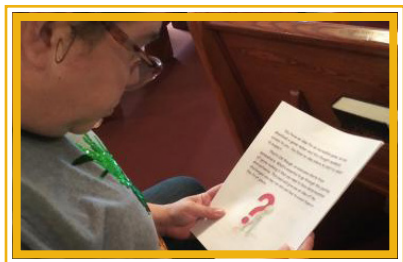
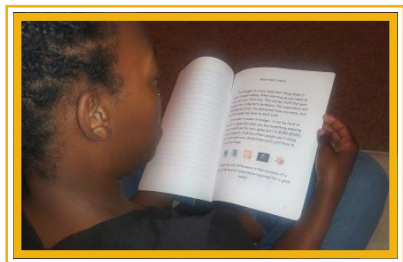
### **Before You Make a Game**

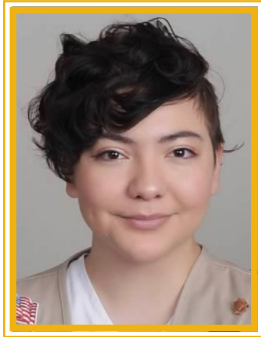

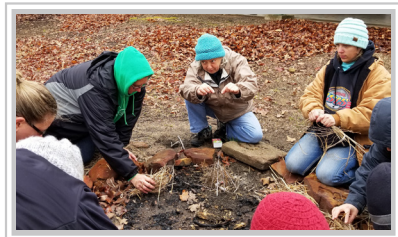

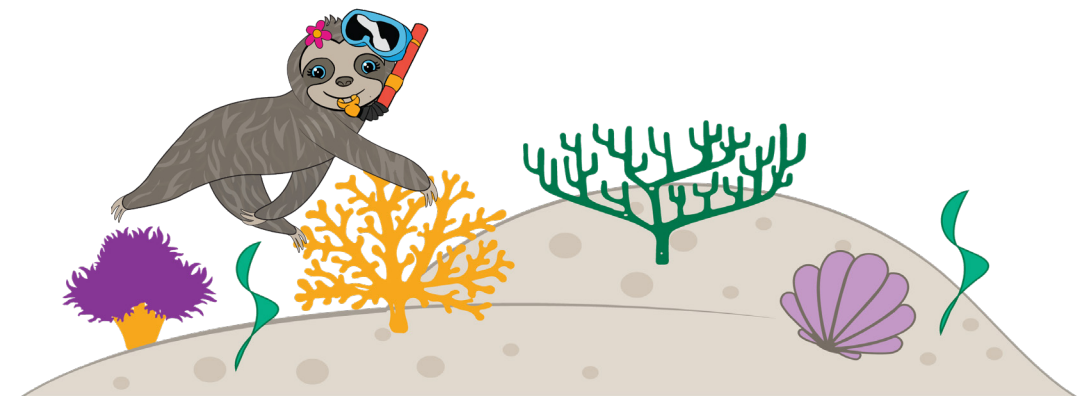
