GIRL SCOUT GOLD AWARD

The mark of the truly remarkable.

Gold Award Girl Scouts are the dreamers and the doers who take "make the world a better place" to the next level. The Girl Scout Gold Award is the mark of the truly remarkable—proof that not only can she make a difference, but that she already has.

Seniors and Ambassadors (grades 9-12) who earn the Girl Scout Gold Award tackle issues that are dear to them and drive lasting change in their communities and beyond. Think of the Girl Scout Gold Award as a key that can open doors to scholarships, preferred admission tracks for college, and amazing career opportunities.







When Megan saw a decrease in cat adoptions, she simultaneously engaged the community with animal shelters and helped cats through her project, Cat Beds for Shelters. Cats become

frightened and anxious when they transition from a shelter to a home. When they arrive at a shelter, they are given their own cat bed, which goes with them when they are adopted into a new family. Having a familiar item throughout these transitions lessens their fear. By working with several local pet adoption agencies and youth volunteers to create comfortable beds, Megan gave cats a familiar anchor and spread the word about their need for a home. Megan reached out to her church and to youth volunteer organizations to continue making the cat beds for the approved shelters. She also ensured her project could help shelters no matter where they were located through creating an instructional worksheet for shelters to hand out and recording a YouTube video on how to make the beds.

Megan was a member of Troop 12 and graduated in May of 2019 from Collinsville High School. She now attends Tulsa Community College.







MAKENZI HINES Fostering for the Future

Advisors – Sherri Hardy, Louise Hoover, and Milissa Hines

Makenzi Hines was aghast at the lack of understanding and education involving fostering animals, and she leaped into action. She began

teaching at Pet Adoption League's (PAL) adoption events and introduced "Foster Fridays" on PAL's social media platforms. She also created flyers to distribute at events and in the community. Makenzi's project will continue to educate with the help of PAL's social media coordinator, who will post "Foster Fridays" and reprint and distribute fostering flyers.

Makenzi has been a Girl Scout for 13 years and is a member of Troop 1260. She will graduate from Jenks High School and will be attending University of Central Oklahoma in the fall where she will be double majoring in Forensic Science: Molecular Biology and Biology. She will also continue her work with animal rescues.

Makenzi's advice to younger Girl Scouts is to take advantage of the programs and activities to try as many new things as you can.











LILIAN (LILY) JONES Buffs Go Green Advisor – Lori Few

Lily created a recycling program throughout the McAlester Public School system. She read materials, presentations, and interactive games to educate herself before visiting each school to pass on her knowledge to students and teachers. She also placed

recycling bins around each school and worked with the Choctaw Nation's Going Green program to obtain a new recycling dumpster. Her recycling program will be sustained by McAlester Public Schools and the Choctaw Nation.

Lily has been a Girl Scout for 12 years and is a member of Troop 78. Her advice to younger Girl Scouts is to always be positive and believe you can do anything you can set your mind to. Lily plans to go to college and major in education.











EMILY MILTON
Focus on Reading
Advisor – Kara Lee

A passionate reader, Emily wanted to share the gift of literacy with others. She created a literacy program at Jenks Care Point focused on younger students and English as a Second Language families. She also

implemented a book drive at Holland Hall and at South Tulsa Baptist Church. With the books she collected, she created a reading program for a Back to School event, where she also discussed the importance of reading, and handed out pamphlets to help get families more involved in the project and to educate them on the benefits of reading and education. To sustain the project, Jenks Care Point distributes the educational pamphlets she created, Holland Hall students and South Tulsa Baptist Church members are continuing book collections, and Emily updates the project's blog regularly.

Emily graduated from Holland Hall in 2019 and was a member of Troop 393.


















CARRIE WITCHEY

Being personally affected by suicide made Carrie Witchey aware that there are not enough resources for teens in her community. To form a new generation of people who look out and care for others, Carrie implemented a suicide prevention program at her

high school. As part of the program, she gave a school-wide presentation over the QPR: Question, Persist, and Refer to Stop Suicide in its Track suicide prevention method during her school's "We Matter Week." She also formed a school committee and created an annual presentation of QPR to continue to change the lives of teens in her school.

Carrie has been a Girl Scout for nine years and is a member of Troop 1438. She plans to attend the University of Central Oklahoma and go to medical school after to become a Forensic Pathologist. She also plans to advocate for suicide awareness throughout the rest of her life. Her advice for younger Girl Scouts is to "keep moving forward."







ANDREA CHANDLER

Jenks East Before-Care

When her high school changed its hours for collaboration days, Andrea noticed that her teachers were required to be at school before their children, which meant that they had to find and pay

for childcare. Wanting her teachers to have an affordable and accessible option, Andrea established a volunteer-led before-school childcare program. She worked with her high school's Key Club, a volunteer club, to provide workers; she also hung fliers up at Jenks East Elementary to inform the teachers about the new before-school child care. The project continues today through Jenks Elementary and the Jenks High School Key Club.

Andrea graduated from Jenks High School in May of 2019. She was a member of Troop 140.
