Girl Scouts Beyond Bars

Do you know a girl whose mother is incarcerated? Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma has a Girl Scouts Beyond Bars (GSBB) program that can assist in reconnecting the girl and her siblings to their mother. By connecting the children with their mother while she is incarcerated, the children can begin working on those anxieties and disruptive behaviors that are caused by this trauma. The girls will be connected with a Girl Scout troop close to home and visit their mother with the GSBB program. Visitation at the correction centers is currently being organized; however, it takes time to make the connection and get approval for children to visit their mother so it can be advantageous to join GSBB as soon as possible.



Ready to Launch

Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma Travel!

Every girl deserves a chance to see the world – whether that means on the other side of town or the other side of the world. Many troops provide opportunities for their members to travel outside of our council area. Troop trips are a great way for girls to learn about planning, budgeting, being flexible, working together as a team, being respectful of each other, and so many other life skills.



In addition to their troop travel, Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma offers girls other opportunities to see new places, meet new people, and learn about different ideas and cultures. These council-sponsored trips are for girls from all over our 30 counties.

Council-sponsored travel is Girl-Led and Girl Focused! That means Girls get to be at the forefront of their trip. During Girl-only meetings they research places to stay, things to see, transportation options, and make sure the trip is staying on budget. We have fun fancy nights out where we practice our manners and etiquette. We take time to learn about the countries or state(s) we are visiting including cultural norms, cultural appropriateness, common phrases, and basic language (if the main language spoken isn't English).

Upcoming Trips:

- October 14-17, 2021: Cadette Break in Denver. Spend your fall break with other Girl Scout Cadettes from across the council on an exciting trip to Denver, CO.
- January 14-17, 2022: Junior Troop Trip to Kansas: Grab your troop and join us for an adventure in Hutchinson, KS.
- March 14-19, 2022: Choose your own adventure during Spring Break (grades 7-12). Show up on day one of the trip and pick an envelope to see what direction we will head and where we will go. Girls will get to practice on-the go travel planning as we choose our adventure as we travel!
- **Summer International Trip 2023**: Explore United Kingdom. Spend 12-16 days exploring all the unique sites in England, Wales, and Scotland. Application submission closes September 30. Girls must be 14 years old by June 1, 2023 to attend this trip.
- Summer National Trip 2024: Where will be go? Help us decide vote here and tell us where you want to travel! Girls must be 13 years old by June 1, 2024 to attend this trip.



Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma is on the lookout for more Trip Advisors to join our committee. Trip Advisors are volunteers who provide supervision and guidance for council-sponsored trips, while encouraging girls to gain confidence and develop leadership skills. Trips advisors must:

- Be at least 25 years old
- Be unrelated to any of the girl participants or other advisors
- Be a current Girl Scout member
- Meet volunteer training requirements
- Successfully complete a background screening
- Able to pay for a portion of the trip fee (may vary by trip but usually 1/3 of the girl cost)

Explore United Kingdom

Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma is going to the United Kingdom in 2023. Spend 12-16 days exploring all the unique sites in England, Wales, and Scotland. What cities will we visit and what will we see? The fun-part is Girls get to decide.

Council-sponsored travel is Girl-Led, and Girl-focused! That means the Girls get to be at the forefront of their trip. During Girl-only meetings you get to research places to stay, things to see, transportation options, and make sure the trip is staying on budget. We have fun fancy nights out where we get to practice our manners and etiquette. We take time to learn about the countries we are visiting including cultural norms, cultural appropriateness, common phrases, and basic language (if the main language spoken isn't English).

The Explore United Kingdom travel troop will meet every other month until August 2022 and then will meet every month until the trip. Meeting dates are given well in advance once trip selections are made and we ask that girls attend 80% of all meetings. We will have specific required meetings that you must attend.

Girl Scouts must be 14 years old by June 1, 2023 to attend this travel opportunity.



Cost & Information

Cost of the trip is \$3,700 with a \$200 non-refundable deposit. All girls selected for the trip must adhere to the following payment schedule/ cancellation policy:

- Program Fee for trip includes a non-refundable deposit due at time of trip selection.
- Half of the trip cost (\$1,850) is due August 31, 2022. Payment in full is due 60 days prior to trip.
- If you choose to cancel your trip, your refund will vary based upon how soon the trip is occurring. Your deposit is nonrefundable under any circumstances. Any portion of a Girl Scout's trip fee that has already been spent, will not be refunded. EX: If plane tickets have already been purchased, the value of those tickets will be deducted from your refund.
- 121+ days prior to trip: 75% refund of trip fee, less deposit and any portion of paid trip fees that has already been spent.
- 60-120 days prior to trip: 50% refund of trip fees paid, less deposit and any portion of paid trip fees that has already been spent.
- 60 days prior to trip: No refunds will be given.
- If a Girl Scout cancels from the trip, any funds earned through travel troop or money-earning opportunities stay with the travel troop.

After paying the initial deposit girls can use Cookie Program Credit to pay the remainder of the fee. The travel troop also plans and participates in extra money-earning projects. Girls may also apply for a travel scholarship through council.

Cadette First Aid Badge Workshop

Cadettes, join EMSA as we complete all the requirements for your First Aid Badge. As you get older, you'll find yourself in charge more and more. That means you need to know what to do if people around you get sick or hurt! Find out how to deal with minor injuries and illnesses and how to tell when the problem is more serious in this badge workshop. This is a troop event.

Canoe and Camping Weekend

Girl Scouts 7th grade and older who have completed a Canoe Level 1: Intro to Canoe course are eligible for this exciting canoeing and camping weekend! Girls will have a weekend of fun while tent camping, cooking out, and building their canoeing skills. This is an individual event.

aMUSE yourself on a weekend Journey. Join other Girl Scout Juniors from across the council for a weekend of FUN! You will spend two nights at Camp Tallchief earning your Junior aMUSE Journey. Explore new roles and bust stereotypes through role-playing, speaking to others, and mixing things up. You will develop increased confidence and inspire others. It's Your Story and you'll get to Tell It! This is a troop event. No Girl Scout is allowed to attend without adult supervision. Leaders must follow all guidelines for an overnight trip, including having a first aider.

This event can and does sell out. Specific guidelines have been established to maximize space available.



Fee includes a non-refundable deposit and there is a fee for adults. The girl fee includes all activities, meals for the weekend, Journey book and patch. Journey Weekends are run by the GSEOK Travel Troop. This a group of older Girl Scouts attending a GSEOK councilsponsored summer trip. Older Girl Scouts plan the weekend and facilitate all activities for Juniors to earn the Journey Award.

Let's Go Hiking

Calling all Brownies, Juniors, and Cadettes! Let's take a hike! This troop event is designed to help Girl Scouts and their troop leaders become more familiar with hiking. Each troop will be paired with one of our Outdoor Educators to lead you along the way. We'll incorporate Leave No Trace and a few other best practices and/or outdoor skills in our time together. This is a troop activity.

All girls who register online will get a STEM Fest patch.

Senior First Aid Badge Workshop

Seniors, join EMSA as we complete all the requirements for your First Aid Badge. As a Girl Scout Senior, you're on the go – home, school, clubs, and activities. Wherever you are, you never know when you'll find yourself in the middle of an emergency. Would you know what to do? In this badge workshop, find out how to differentiate between minor and major injuries, provide emergency treatment in some life-threatening situations, and share important information about injuries and illnesses. This is a troop event.



Senior Journey Weekend: Mission Sisterhood

Have you just bridged to the Girl Scout Senior level? Do you need to complete a journey before you can start your Gold Award? If so, this is your chance to get a jump-start on the Mission: Sisterhood journey! Sisterhood is about making connections with other females that expands your potential and gives you the power to shape a better story for all women and girls. Normally, this Journey takes multiple weeks to complete, however, we will complete most of it in a weekend! We will be spending two nights at Camp Swannie. This is an individual event.

Spectacular Stargazing

Let's start the 2021-2022 school year off reaching for the stars! All Girl Scouts and their families are invited to join us at the Hardesty Leadership Center for a fun evening exploring the science of our universe with hands-on activities and telescope viewing under the night sky (council has a brand new Unistellar eVscope, a state of the art telescope that gives unparalleled crisp and detailed views of the universe). Older Girl Scouts can learn all about APEX Astronomy Club and find out how to join!

*Troop Event: Girls must attend with their leader or a parent/guardian. Leaders must follow all guidelines for a daytime activity including adult/girl ratio.

*Individual Event: Girls sign up individually. Permission slip is provided and required to attend.

Cookie Program Credit Usage

Cookie Program Credit works similar to your typical gift card. It is an individual reward acknowledging a girl's hard work and entreprenurial success. Girls can use their Cookie Program Credit for Girl Scout programs and merchandise!

Check Cookie Program Credit balance at any time by visiting: <u>https://</u> <u>mps.bz/</u> and entering card number, BID number, and CVV code from your email.

Using your Cookie Program Credit to pay activity fees is easy! Here's how:

Select the Cookie Program Credit icon (looks like a gift card) to use the girl's Cookie Program Credit during the payment portion of registering for an activity. Once selected, a box will pop up to enter the 19-digit number.

Should the payment required exceed the amount of Cookie Program Credit, the available amount will be applied, and then you will be prompted for another form of payment. You will see on the right-hand side the Cookie Program Credit applied to the balance. Once the other form of payment has been selected and information entered, select "Make Payment"; after the payment is processed you will receive a confirmation email/receipt of payment.

Programs General

All activities require advance registration and payment by the registration deadline.

- All deposits are non-refundable and nontransferable
- In the event activity fees do not require a deposit, all payments made upon registration are non-refundable and non-transferable
- Cancellations must be received before the registration deadline.
- There are no refunds after the registration deadline

The individual making the registration will be responsible for any balance due for:

- cancellations received after the registration deadline
- any balance due for girls who are "no shows"

Resident Camp

All activities require advance registration and payment by the registration deadline.

- All deposits are non-refundable and nontransferable
- Cancellations must be received before the registration deadline
- There are no refunds after the registration deadline

The individual making the registration will be responsible for any balance due for:

- Cancellations received after the registration deadline
- Any balance due for girls who are "no shows"

No refund will be given for campers:

- Arriving with active bed bugs, lice, eggs, or nits
- Arriving late or leaving early
- Who are sent home for communicable diseases
- Who are sent home for exhibiting improper behavior
