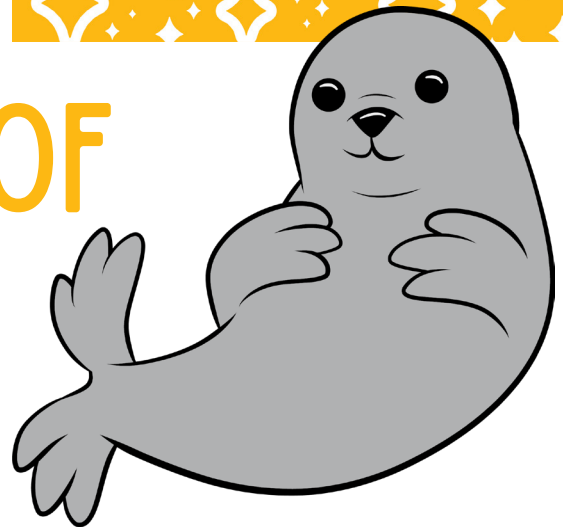

COOKIE PROGRAM CREDIT

USING YOUR COOKIE PROGRAM CREDIT TO PAY ACTIVITY FEES IS EASY & HERE'S HOW!

Cookie Program Credit works similar to your typical gift card. It is an individual reward acknowledging a girl's hard work and entrepreneurial success. Girls can use their Cookie Program Credit for Girl Scout programs and merchandise!

Check Cookie Program Credit balance at any time by visiting: <https://www.storecard.com/> and entering card number, and CVV code from your email.

IN SHORT EASY STEPS!

During the payment portion of registering for an activity, select the Cookie Program Credit icon to use the girl's Cookie Program Credit. Once selected, a box will pop up to enter the 19-digit number.

Should the payment required exceed the amount of Cookie Program Credit, the available amount will be applied, and then you will be prompted for another form of payment. You will see on the right-hand side the Cookie Program Credit applied to the balance.

Once the other form of payment has been selected and information entered, select "Make Payment."

After the payment is processed you will receive a confirmation email/receipt of payment.





HIGHEST AWARDS

Every Girl Scout goes above and beyond to make a difference in her community and the greater world. The skills and experiences she gains along the way set her up for special recognition through the Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards.

The council should be notified of girls working on Bronze and Silver Awards. Visit gseok.org/bronze or gseok.org/silver, complete the form online, and submit the Intent to Earn, and after completion, the Final Report.

The Girl Scout Gold Award requires council approval before beginning work on the project. Use Go Gold Online to apply for the Gold Award (gogold.girlscouts.org). Girls who complete their project and submit their final report by December 31 may be eligible to receive their award at a celebration in the following April of the same year.

GIRL SCOUTS BRONZE AWARD

When Girl Scout Juniors team up to make a difference in their community, they learn important leadership skills, discover new passions, and watch how seemingly small actions make a big difference. It all adds up to the Girl Scout Bronze Award—the highest honor a Junior can achieve. Download the [Bronze Award guidelines](#) to find out how.

GIRL SCOUTS BEYOND BARS

Do you know a girl whose mother is incarcerated? Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma has a Girl Scouts Beyond Bars (GSBB) program that can assist in reconnecting the girl and her siblings to their mother. By connecting the children with their mother while she is incarcerated, the children can begin working on those anxieties and disruptive behaviors that are caused by this trauma. The girls will be connected with a Girl Scout troop close to home and visit her mother with the GSBB program. It takes time to make the connection and get approval for children to visit their mother so it is advantageous to join GSBB as soon as possible. THE JULIETTE LOW LEADERSHIP SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP

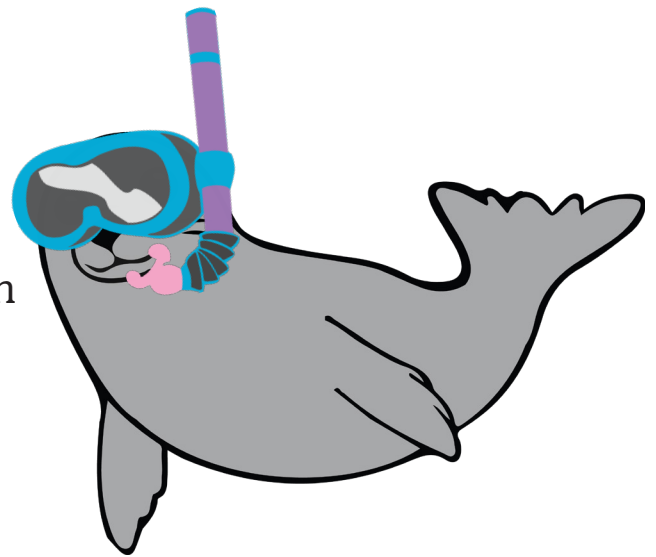
GLOBAL ACTION DAYS PATCH PROGRAM

Every Girl Scout is part of a special group of girls that stretches not just across the United States, but around the world. Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA) is a member of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), which includes 10 million girls in 150 countries. All those girls, in all those countries, are working to make the world a better place.



Throughout the year, girls have the opportunity to work together and participate in Girl Scout programming that relates to different global issues affecting women and girls. The nine Global Days of Action Girl Scouts participates in are:

- World Thinking Day
- International Women's Day
- Global Youth Service Day
- Global Action Week for Education
- Girls in ICT Day
- World Environment Day
- International Day of the Girl
- Global Poverty Day
- 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence

Beginning October 1, any Girl Scout that celebrates 3 of the Global Action Days during the Girl Scout year by completing at least 1 activity from the Global Action Days Toolkit for each day will be eligible to receive a free patch. REFUND & CANCELLATION POLICY FOR PROGRAM EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

All activities require advance registration and payment by the registration deadline.

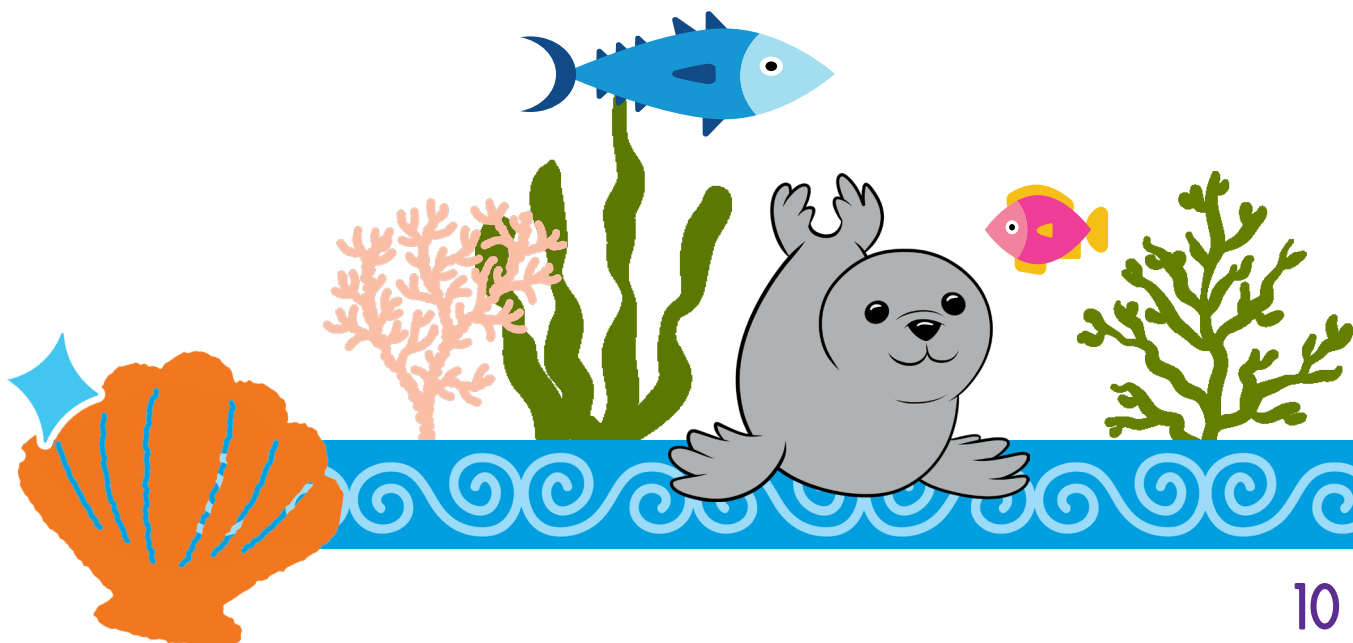
- ✿ All deposits are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- ✿ In the event activity fees do not require a deposit, full payment is required for registration. Refunds for non-attendance are not granted due to limited number of spots available.
- ✿ Cancellations must be received before the registration deadline.
- ✿ There are no refunds after the registration deadline.

The individual making the registration will be responsible for any balance due for:

- ✿ Cancellations received after the registration deadline
- ✿ Any balance due for girls who are "no shows"

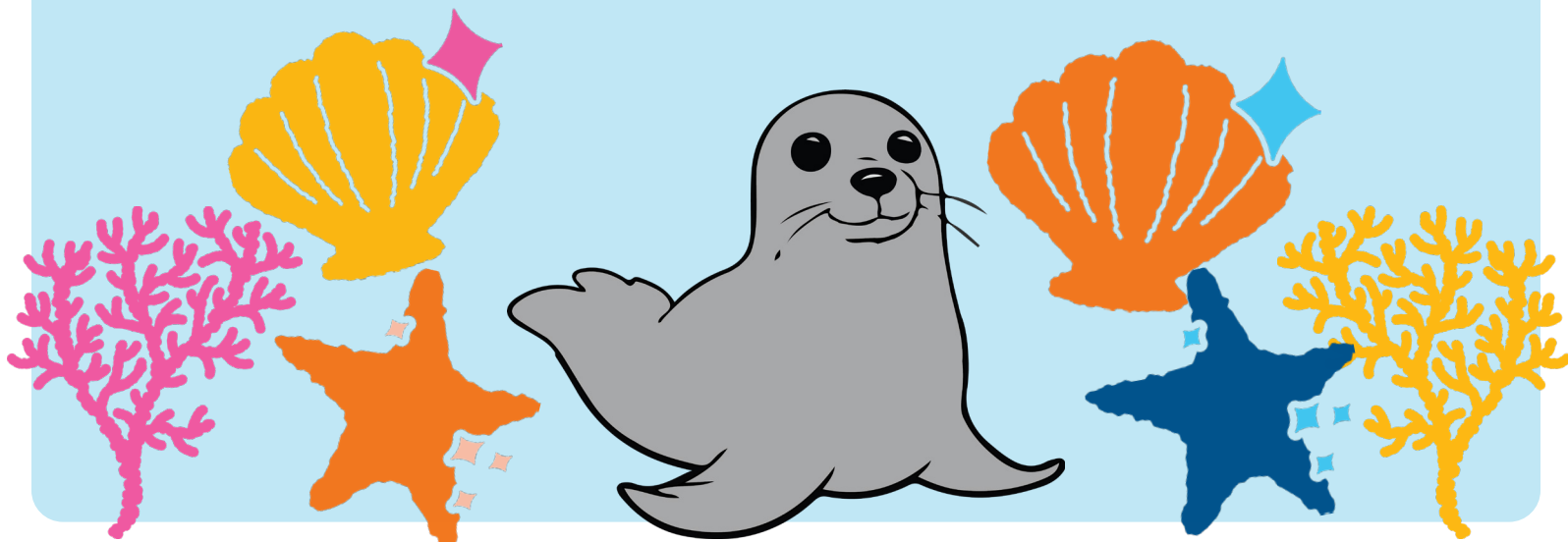
On occasion, a third-party event will not allow refunds at any time after a registration has been made, this will be noted in the event description.

I: Individual Event: Girls sign up individually. Permission slip is provided and required to attend. Individual events are designed to supplement the troop experience and give girls the opportunity to meet new friends and have exciting outdoor exeriences they may not have the opportunity to do with their troop.

T: Troop Event: Girls must attend with their leader or a parent/guardian. Leaders must follow all guidelines for a daytime activity including adult/girl ratio.

✦ AQUARIUM OVERNIGHT

Ever dream of sleeping with the sharks? Come join us at the Oklahoma Aquarium for our Sleep with the Sharks overnight event! The fun-filled night includes a light snack, dive show, self-guided scavenger hunt and flashlight tour, a movie and then sweet sea-themed dreams! This is a troop event for all levels.

Leader must have completed Beyond the Meeting. Space is limited. Please only register for the necessary adult/girl ratio. Fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

✦ BROWNIE BOOGIE

Work towards the Brownie Dancer Badge with the Oklahoma Performing Arts staff and students! Tons of fun and laughter at this event! This is a troop event for Brownies. **Leaders must have completed Beyond the Meeting.**

✦ CADETTE JOURNEY WEEKEND - AMAZE

Get ready to aMAZE yourself on this weekend Journey. Join other Girl Scout Cadettes from across council for a weekend of FUN! You will spend two nights at Camp Tallchief earning your Cadette aMAZE Journey. You'll learn how to navigate the twist and turns of friendship, meaningful relationships, and confidence to boot. You will complete most of the requirements for the Journey. We will give you the tools on how to complete any part of the Journey you do not complete (Take Action Project). **Girl Scouts must attend the full weekend in order to earn their Journey.**

This is a troop event. Girls must attend with their leader or a parent/guardian. **No Girl Scout is allowed to attend without an adult.** Leaders must follow all guidelines for an overnight trip, including having a first aider. Sleeping space is limited at camp. In order to provide a quality program to as many girls as possible the following guidelines are in place:

- ✦ Max of 2 adults per 12 Girl Scouts in a troop, may bring 1 extra adult per 6 Girl scouts (after the initial 12)
- ✦ Troops with less than 12 Girl Scouts will be in a shared cabin with another troop
- ✦ Troops with more than 12 Girl Scouts will be split up into 2 cabins
- ✦ Troops with less than 4 Girl Scouts attending are asked to only bring 1 adult
- ✦ Girls attending with parent/guardian (not the rest of their troop) will be placed in a cabin with other troops

Fee: \$60 per girl (includes a \$25 non-refundable deposit), and \$20 per adult. This price includes all activities, meals for the weekend, Journey book and patch.

Journey Weekends are run by the GSEOK Travel Troop. This a group of older Girl Scouts attending a GSEOK council-sponsored summer trip. Older Girl Scouts plan the weekend including running all activities to earn the Journey Award.

✦ CAMP CLEAN UP DAY AT CAMP WAH-SHAH-SHE

Join us at Camp Wah-Shah-She on October 15th from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for Camp Clean Up Day! This is a great opportunity to enjoy the out of doors while helping preserve the beauty of our camp. Projects include trail clean up, hanging signs, sweeping, cleaning windows, painting, and planting trees as part of the Girls Scout Tree Promise. **Leader must have completed Beyond the Meeting.**

CANOE LEVEL 2: INTRO TO RIVER CANOEING

Prerequisite for this course: Girls must have successfully completed a Canoe Level 1: Introduction to Canoeing course and must be a 7th grader or older. The Canoe Level 2 course adds to girl's knowledge and skills learned in Canoe Level 1 by introducing the maneuvers needed to paddle on moving water (rivers). Girls are welcome to take this course multiple times.

✿ CANOE RENDEZVOUS

Brownies and older are invited to discover new canoeing skills and see what it feels like to try them out and succeed. A fun-filled session on the water canoeing and connecting with other Girl Scouts will leave you with lasting memories! Participants should be in good physical condition and able to tread water and swim in water over their heads. This is a troop event for Brownies and older.

Leaders must have completed Beyond the Meeting.

CANOEING AND CAMPING ON THE CURRENT RIVER

Girl Scouts who have completed Canoe Level 2 & are 14 years old or older are welcome to participate in this exciting canoeing and camping weekend! Girls will have a weekend of fun while tent camping, cooking out, and building their canoeing skills along the Current River.

CANOEING AND HIKING AT THE BUFFALO RIVER

Join us for a wonderful weekend of tent camping and hiking at the Buffalo River! There can't be a better way to spend a fall weekend. Cadettes, Seniors, & Ambassadors invited!

CHILDCARE WORKSHOP

Girl Scouts 12 years old and older! This Childcare Workshop will give teenagers everything they need to know for safe and successful babysitting. From getting started with their business, dealing with parents and children, to key safety, caregiving and first aid tips. Upon successful completion of course testing, they will be certified in Child & Babysitting Safety. Certification valid for 2 years.

✿ DOLLARS AND SENSE

Bucks! Cash! Moola! Bacon! Green Country Money Matters is partnering with GSEOK to provide Girl Scouts of all levels an opportunity to learn and earn their financial literacy badge! The day will be filled with fun, practical, hands on activities to build girls' confidence and interest in smart financial practices. Each Girl Scout will leave the event with their badge in hand and a wealth of knowledge. This is a troop event for all levels. **Leader must have completed Beyond the Meeting.** Fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

FALL BREAK TRIP TO DENVER

Spend your fall break with other Cadettes from across the council on an exciting trip to Denver, CO! Explore the sites of downtown Denver. Visit the Molly Brown House. Discover the Denver Museum of Nature and Science. Enjoy a night of dinner theater. This is an individual event for Cadettes. Girls attending the trip and their parent(s) are required to attend a parent meeting.

GIRL SCOUT GAME NIGHT

Let's start the 2022-2023 school year with a game night! All Girl Scouts and their families are invited to join us at the Hardesty Leadership Center in Tulsa as your favorite games get mega-sized. Games will come to life at this fun event. Learn about Girl Scout Programs and get to see Girl Scouts from all across the council for this extraordinary event!

✦ FIREFLY FLOAT

If you are a Girl Scout Junior (or older) and have attended Canoe Rendezvous or a Canoe Level 1 class, plan to come out for this special glow-in-the-dark canoeing event held just as the evening sun sets. You don't have to let the night darkness get in your way – bring glow sticks to decorate your canoe and yourself! It'll be a magical night on the water that you don't want to miss. Girls must be in good physical condition, and be able to tread water and swim in water over their heads. This is a troop event for Juniors and older. **Leader must have completed Beyond the Meeting.**

✦ GIRL SCOUTS LOVE STATE PARKS WEEKEND

Let's celebrate our shared love of the outdoors. Every year, Girl Scouts explore the natural wonders found across our country during the Girl Scouts Love State Parks weekend. Girl Scouts nationwide, along with their troops, friends, and families, celebrate our shared love of the outdoors. Plan now to visit one of our State Parks September 10 & 11.

✦ GO GOLD WORKSHOP

Are you ready to Go Gold? Learn about the prerequisites you need to complete before beginning the Gold Award process. Join in on this informal meeting and let's talk about it! This online course is required for girls prior to working on their Gold Award. This is an individual event for Seniors and Ambassadors.

✦ JUNK DRAWER ARTISAN

All are invited to let their imaginations run wild at Junk Drawer Artisan. Each Girl Scout attending will receive their own 'junk drawer' and have two hours to envision and execute a creation using their artistry and ingenuity. What is a 'junk drawer'? It's an accumulation of goodies, whatchacallits, and doodads that you will use to create something only you can dream up! Join us for this creative, hand on event!

✦ JULIETTE GORDON LOW BIRTHDAY TEA PARTY

Join us as we celebrate the birthday of our amazing founder Juliette Gordon Low with one of her favorite past times... a Tea Party! Girl Scouts will get to learn about the amazing life of Juliette Gordon Low and how she started the very first Girl Scout troop. You will get to participate in some fun badge activities out of the original Girl Scout Handbook (How Girls can help their country). Get to know a little bit about the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS) and how we came to be a part of a global organization. Make sure to wear your uniform to the event (girls and adults). Don't miss out on a day of sisterhood, history, and fun!

✦ JUNIOR JOURNEY WEEKEND - AMUSE

The girl fee includes all activities, meals for the weekend, Journey book and patch. Journey Weekends are run by the GSEOK Travel Troop. This a group of older Girl Scouts attending a GSEOK council-sponsored summer trip. Older Girl Scouts plan the weekend and facilitate all activities for Juniors to earn the Journey Award.

✿ LET'S GO HIKING

Calling all Girl Scouts! Let's take a hike! This troop event is designed to help Girl Scouts and their troop leaders become more familiar with hiking. PADDLE DAY

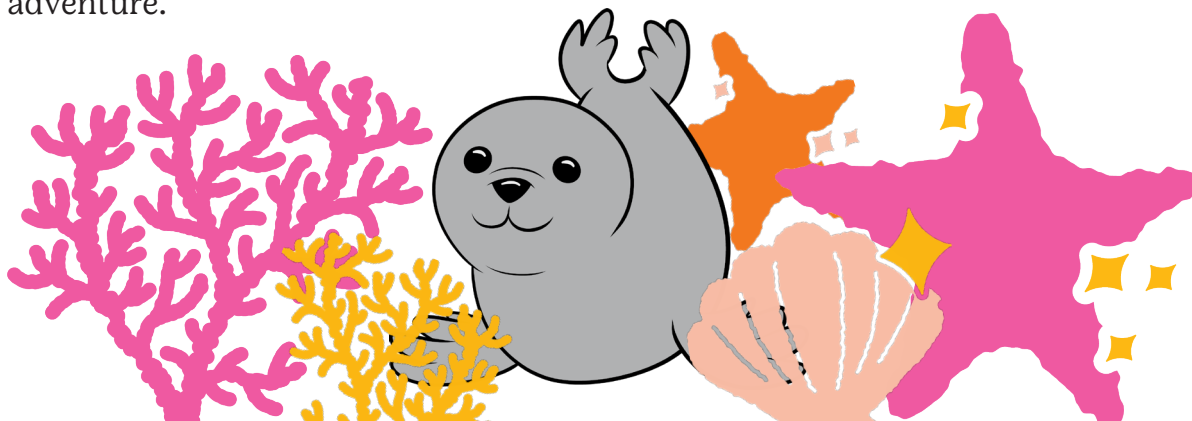
