# **Green 2 Troops – Brownie Senses Badge**

Goal: Explore the five senses while keeping activities waste-free and planet-friendly.

# Step 1: Look Around

Create a *Nature I-Spy Journal* from scrap paper or a reused notebook.

- Go outside and find items for each color of the rainbow.
- Draw or describe them no collecting, just observing.
- Optional: Use an old paper bag or box as a "viewfinder" to frame what you see.
- No waste tip: Use pencils, crayons, or markers you already have. Reuse paper, no printing fresh pages.

### Step 2: Listen to the World

Play The Sound Scavenger Hunt.

- Make a list of 10 sounds (birdsong, leaves rustling, footsteps, a car horn, etc.) on reused paper.
- Sit quietly for 5 minutes and try to hear them all.
- Girls can add their own sounds to the list.
- Girl-led twist: Let girls lead the group in identifying and mimicking sounds.

#### Step 3: Put Your Nose to Work

Do a Mystery Smell Challenge using kitchen spices, herbs, or citrus peels.

- Place small amounts in reusable containers (jars, lids, cloth bags).
- Girls close their eyes, smell, and guess the scent.
- Discuss how scent can connect to memories.
- No waste tip: Use ingredients you already have and compost any leftovers.

# Step 4: Take a Taste Test

Host a Fruit & Veggie Flavor Adventure.

- Try three small bites of different produce ideally local or seasonal.
- Compare sweet, sour, bitter, salty, and umami flavors.
- Chart results on scrap paper or a reusable whiteboard.
- Girl-led twist: Let girls vote for their favorite and brainstorm recipes using that item.

#### Step 5: Touch and Feel

Play Guess the Object with a reusable "mystery bag."

- Place natural items (pinecone, smooth rock, feather, leaf) inside.
- Without looking, each girl describes the texture before guessing what it is.
- No waste tip: Use objects found outside or from around the home no store-bought props.

# Green<sup>2</sup> Bonus Challenge:

Create a "Senses Collage" using only items from recycling bins, nature finds, and scrap fabric. Each section represents one sense. Display for families or at a troop meeting.
