



# Green<sup>2</sup> Troops: Cadette Book Artist Badge

**Purpose:** Discover the art of bookmaking and create your own while using sustainable, eco-friendly, and waste-free methods.

## Overall Green<sup>2</sup> Strategies

- Materials: Use scrap paper, old envelopes, cereal boxes, and other repurposed materials.
- Tools: Borrow paper cutters, rulers, and awls from schools, libraries, or art friends.
- Bindings: Choose reusable or biodegradable binding materials like natural twine or cloth strips.
- Decorations: Use natural dyes, stamps, or drawings instead of stickers or purchased embellishments.

### Step 1 - Explore the Art of Bookbinding

Goal: Learn different ways to make a book.

- Research bookbinding methods online or borrow books from the library.
- Visit a local print shop or bindery to see techniques firsthand.
- Take notes digitally to avoid extra paper use.

### Step 2 - Get Familiar With the Tools

Goal: Learn how to use tools safely and effectively.

- Practice on scrap paper to avoid wasting new materials.
- Use reusable cutting mats, metal rulers, and repurposed cardboard for covers.
- Keep all leftover materials organized for future projects.

## **Step 3 - Try Out Different Styles**

Goal: Make mini sample books to learn various bindings.

- Create tiny books from scrap materials to test techniques.
- Bind with natural twine, ribbon, or fabric strips from old clothing.
- Swap finished mini-books with troop members instead of buying new supplies.

#### Step 4 - Focus on Your Artistic Style

Goal: Decorate your book in a way that reflects you.

- Use natural dyes (coffee, tea, turmeric) to color paper.
- Stamp designs with found objects (leaf prints, corks, bottle caps).
- Repurpose old art, maps, or calendar pages as decorative covers.

#### Step 5 - Make and Share Your Book

Goal: Create a complete book and share it with others.

- Fill your book with hand-drawn art, poetry, or journaling instead of printing.
- Gift it in a reused box, jar, or fabric pouch.

• Share photos digitally and encourage others to try waste-free bookmaking.

## **At-Home & Family Connection**

- Make a small notebook for a family member using only household scraps.
- Teach your family how to repair or rebind an old book instead of buying new.
- Work together to create a family recipe or memory book from upcycled materials.

## Waste-Free Wrap-Up

- Reflect as a troop: Which binding method was easiest? Which looked best?
- Pass along leftover materials to another troop or school art program.
- Keep reusable tools in a shared troop craft bin for future projects.
