



# Green<sup>2</sup> Troops: Cadette Woodworker Badge

**Purpose**: Build confidence with tools and learn basic woodworking skills while using sustainable, salvaged, and zero-waste materials.

# Overall Green<sup>2</sup> Strategies

- Materials: Use only scrap wood, reclaimed lumber, or leftover craft wood from hardware stores or construction sites.
- Tools: Borrow or share tools within the troop, school, or community.
- Finishes: Use natural oils, beeswax, or non-toxic stains.
- Project Planning: Keep designs minimal and multifunctional to reduce waste.

## Step 1 - Swing a Hammer

Goal: Learn how to safely use basic hand tools.

- Use tools already owned by troop families, schools, or makerspaces.
- Practice on scrap wood or repurposed boards.
- Wear reusable cloth gloves and safety goggles instead of disposables.

#### Step 2 - Keep It Level

Goal: Measure, mark, and level accurately.

- Use repurposed rulers, levels, and carpenter's squares.
- Practice measuring on scrap cardboard or scrap wood before cutting.
- Use a digital design app or chalk markings to sketch ideas first.

#### Step 3 - Use a Saw

Goal: Learn how to safely use a saw under adult supervision.

- Cut only salvaged wood pieces or broken furniture parts.
- Set up an outdoor "woodworking zone" to avoid wasteful drop cloths.
- Sweep up sawdust for compost (if untreated wood) or use as mulch.

#### Step 4 - Build Something

**Goal**: Make a simple project like a box, shelf, or birdhouse.

- Design with minimal cuts and no extra pieces.
- Use screws or nails from previous projects or community donations.
- Create items with a purpose—e.g., a compost caddy, seed-starting tray, or upcycled display shelf.

#### Step 5 - Go the Extra Mile

Goal: Finish your project and make it shine.

Sand with reused sanding blocks or cloths.

- Stain or seal using natural oils (olive, coconut, linseed) or beeswax.
- Decorate with reusable stencils, woodburning tools, or eco-friendly paints.

### **At-Home & Family Connection**

- Help a family member repair or refinish a wooden item instead of replacing it.
- Build a birdhouse or planter box together using salvaged wood.
- Create a wood scrap bin at home for future reuse.

## Waste-Free Wrap-Up

- Reflect as a troop: What did you learn about reuse and craftsmanship?
- Donate any useful projects to schools, shelters, or libraries.
- Store leftover wood and tools for future Green<sup>2</sup> badge work or troop service projects.
