



Green² Troops: Animal Observer

Purpose: Learn to watch, listen to, and understand animals while leaving no waste behind.

Girl-Led Focus: Girls choose which animals to observe, decide how to record their findings, and lead group sharing.

Waste-Free Commitment: Use found/natural materials, reuse supplies, and avoid single-use plastics or printed paper when possible.

Step 1 - Be an Animal Observer

Goal: Practice looking and listening for animals in your environment.

Waste-Free Activity Ideas:

- **Observation Walk:** Take a short walk around your meeting space, backyard, or park. Girls use their eyes, ears, and noses to notice animals or signs of animals (tracks, feathers, nests).
- **Found Object Binoculars:** Make pretend binoculars from toilet paper rolls collected ahead of time (secure with string or ribbon you already have no tape or glue if possible). Decorate with crayons or markers you already own.

Girl-Led Option: Let each girl decide where to explore first & which senses to use most (sight, sound,)

Step 2 - Play an Animal Observation Game

Goal: Learn animal facts through fun, movement-based games.

Waste-Free Activity Ideas:

- Camouflage Hide & Seek: One girl "hides" as an animal while others close eyes and count. She tries to blend in with surroundings indoors or outdoors.
- Animal Charades: Girls act out an animal's movements or sounds, others guess.
- Sound Safari: Play recordings or imitate wildlife sounds and have girls guess the animal.

Girl-Led Option: Girls vote on which game(s) to play and can make their own rules.

Step 3 - Focus on One Animal

Goal: Learn more about one animal you like and share it with your troop or family.

Waste-Free Activity Ideas:

- **Nature Drawing:** Use scrap paper or the backs of used sheets to draw the animal and label features (color, size, home, diet).
- Story Time: Girls tell a short made-up story about their animal and how it lives in nature.
- **Verbal Presentation:** No materials just share 3 cool facts about the animal.

Girl-Led Option: Girls choose their animal and decide how to share it (story, drawing, fact-sharing).

At-Home with Family Component

Goal: Share what you've learned and inspire your family to notice animals.

Waste-Free Ideas:

- Neighborhood Animal Log: Go for a walk with your family and write/draw the animals you see.
- **Kitchen Wildlife Watch:** Observe from a window birds at a feeder, squirrels in a tree and discuss with family members.
- Family Nature Game: Teach them the animal charades or sound safari game.

Reflection & Green² Check

Ask:

- "What was your favorite animal we saw or learned about?"
- "How can we help keep animals safe and healthy?"
- "Did we make any trash today? If yes, how can we avoid it next time?"
