



Green² Troops: Animal Habitats

Badge Purpose:

Girls learn how animals live and how to protect their homes—while reducing their own footprint.

Supplies Overview (Waste-Free):

- Scrap paper/cardboard for journals
- Natural materials for model habitats
- Binoculars (reuse or DIY from tubes)
- Local maps
- Upcycled containers for bird feeders or bee homes

Eco-Leadership Tips:

- Outdoor exploration = zero electricity
- All models made with reused/natural materials
- Share findings digitally, not on printouts

Step 1: Explore Animal Homes

Activity: Take a neighborhood walk to observe nests, burrows, or habitats. No collection.

Step 2: Investigate an Animal Neighborhood

Activity: Research a native species using a library book or digital resource. Map its habitat using scrap materials.

Step 3: Create an Animal House

Activity: Make bird feeders from toilet rolls and seed; build bee hotels from bamboo or sticks.

Step 4: Help Protect Animal Homes

Activity: Do a habitat cleanup (trash pickup, invasive plant removal, or erosion barrier using sticks and rocks).

Step 5: Share What You Know

Activity: Create short videos, skits, or visual displays (digital or cardboard) showing how humans can protect habitats.
