## Land Acknowledgement

Adopted February 1, 2026

Girl Scouts of Eastern Oklahoma respectfully acknowledges that our council headquarters, camps, and programming sites exist on the traditional lands of the Wahzhazhe (Osage), Mvskoke (Muscogee [Creek]), Tsálägī (Cherokee), and Chahta (Choctaw) Nations, along with the many other Indigenous peoples who have called this region home since time immemorial.

We also recognize and honor the Tribal Nations whose homelands lie in the surrounding directions from where we gather, including the Hasinai (Caddo), Kaw (Kansa), Pawnee, Pá'ka (Ponca), Thâkiwaki (Sac and Fox), Seminole, Bodéwadmi (Citizen Potawatomi), Kiikaapoa (Kickapoo), Báxoje (Iowa), and Otoe-Missouria Nations.

Our Headquarters (Hardesty Leadership Center) exists within the boundaries of the Mvskoke (Muscogee [Creek]) Nation Reservation in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

As an organization dedicated to empowering girls and building future leaders, we recognize our responsibility to understand the history of the land on which we gather, learn, and explore. We commit to fostering meaningful and respectful relationships with Tribal Nations across our 30-county region.

We honor Indigenous peoples as the original stewards of this land, and we strive to ensure our programs reflect respect, inclusivity, and opportunities for partnership, education, and engagement with tribal communities.
